



UltraTough M&I Installed in the Largest Gold Mine in South America



Yanacocha Gold Mine located some 375 miles north of Lima, in Peru at an elevation of 14,000 feet above sea level, is the crown jewel of Newmont Mining Company. It is the largest gold mine in South America, operating a complex of four gold mines and a processing facility including the largest open pit heap-leach operation in the world. Yanacocha currently produces ore from five open pits.

For their new truck shop and wash bay facilities, Yanacocha demanded a nearly indestructible door. The dimensions of the doors required for this location could only be handled by our **Re-Coil-Away**, today known as the **UltraBig M&I**. The doors needed to be tough enough to handle the 250 payload ton trucks passing through them every day. The decision to install six Re-Coil-Away doors was made soon after we proved that we built the "World's Toughest High Speed Rubber Door" backed by a LIFETIME warranty on the fabric. Easy installation was another factor for selecting the **Re-Coil-Away**. The six doors were manufactured and shipped into Peru early in 2003.

The **Re-Coil-Away** is helping Yanacocha save money in maintenance cost, if accidentally hit, the door curtain and bottom beam absorbs the impact and it could be re-assemble within minutes by their own personnel. And with speeds of up to 36" per second and near airtight seal, the doors keep the mine and it's crew on schedule everyday by allowing traffic to move freely.
